## Planning Board

After some time off this summer, the Planning Board will begin work on a mobile home park ordinance. We will also be working on shoreland zoning, to bring the Zoning Ordinance into compliance with the new state regulations. Additionally, we will begin work on an impact fee ordinance and a site plan review ordinance. The Planning Board will meet the first and third Mondays of each month. The Board will conduct Planning Board business on the first Monday only. Residents are asked to make an appointment with the Planning Board Chair, Lucy Stinson, if they have any business before the Board. She can be reached at 443-3954. On the third Monday, the Board will meet in a less formal workshop mode, drafting ordinances, etc. ALL meetings are open to the public. Town residents should feel free to attend and participate.

## Fire Department

The Fire Department will host their annual Open House on Wednesday, Oct. 11 from 6:30 on at the Town Hall. Equipment and Firefighters will be on hand from Arrowsic, Bath, West Bath, Georgetown, and Woolwich. There will be movies and demonstrations, and the Ladies Auxillary will supply refreshments. Come on down, and bring the kids.

# Civil Emergency Preparedness

Up until this year, Ted Bertocci has been the Director of Civil Emergency Preparedness. Tony Carey has been appointed for this year, and will be in charge of the annual Maine Yankee Emergency Evacuation Drill The drill will take place sometime in November: the siren will sound at the Firehouse, and some Town Officials along with the Fire Department will meet at the Town Hall. At that point, they will await further instruction in the form of a phone call from Maine Yankee telling them to proceed with the drill. They will then grab megaphones, and drive down every road in town announcing an "emergency." When they have reached every household, they will rendevous back at the Town Hall, and Maine Yankee officials, or a Federal Emergency Management Association Official will be on hand to critique how the drill went, including the length of time it took to reach everyone, and the general organization of those involved. Although we don t know exactly when the drill will take place, we wanted to notify people so they won't panic when they here the sirens. We will publish a reminder in the next newsletter
