## Dear Reader.

Have you been thinking it's time for something new in your life? Have you been feeling more and more frustrated with the way things are, and wishing you could do something to make the world a better place? Would you like to make a difference? Change starts with a decision, and is sustained with commitment. The world begins with where we live. Join your friends and neighbors in their efforts to make our world a better place. Become part of Town Government- if you don't like how it is, come help change it. Tell us what you think might work. The Selectmen are looking for members for the Planning Board, the Recycling Committee, the Conservation Commission, and other town officers. Or join the chorus and sing (443-6174). Or come and dance (article following). Or pick up litter off the roadways (article following). Or plant tulips and daffodils somewhere secret this fall and surprize someone next spring. Whatever you do have a safe and healthy autumn.

Coastal Cleanup week is October 3rd through October 10th. Since our Annual Spring Roadside pickup was rained out both days this year, we thought this would be a great opportunity to pickup where we left off (pun intended). This time will be very informal: we will have trash bags provided by the State available at the Town Hall on Saturday and Sunday, October 3 and 4. You can grab a bag (or several) and mark the map where you are going to work, so others won't redo what you do. You can either leave the bags along the side of the road and someone will pick them up, or bring them back to the town hall. T&R will come out Monday the 5th and haul away the trash. For other area activities, see the poster on the bulletin board at the Town Hall.

And speaking of garbage...we can now recycle metal cans, but before rushing to the Town Hall and dumping them in the barrels, PLEASE: 1) rinse all cans, 2) remove labels, 3) flatten as much as possible (those unibody cans can be pounded to death with a sledge hammer by some angry member of the family) 4) separate aluminum from steel, a magnet will quickly tell you which is which-little kids love to go through and sort them out. 5) take them to the town hall-the tin cans go into the appropriate barrel, and the aluminum cans go into the little white building in a bag. Thanks.

-Also, HDPE or #2 plastic must now be separated into 2 types: the clear (but not transparent) kind, i.e. milk jugs; and the colored kind, i.e. ricotta cheese and yogurt containers. Crush the plastics as flat as possible.

There is a dumpster at the town hall for each type, please make sure to use the proper bin.

-Engine oil containers are no longer acceptable because the oil is a contaminant. Vegetable oil containers are fine.

-Those plastic bags that are officially #2 plastic should not be put in bins with other #2 plastic...they are considered "film" and should be recycled by taking them back to Shaw's, which recycles them.

The Road Commission wants you to know they will be paving the South end of the Old Stage Road, the Mill Island Road, and the Indian Rest Road in the weeks to come. Please forgive the temporary inconvenience.


