ARSWC Meeting Minutes

Attendees: Bill Nickerson, Paul Schlein, Jon Biehler, Roz McLean, Katie Smith

Meeting start time: 5:30 via Zoom

Meeting end time: 6:45

Approval of minutes from February and April - deferred until next meeting. Had only three people able to vote.

HHW and Roadside Cleanup cancelled until next spring. **Katie** will ask Sukey if we can keep the money budgeted for the HHW in our budget for next year.

New brochure about places to get things repaired.- Can we start a spreadsheet with names, services, email, street address for information gathering? There is no rush on this, as we believe many people aren't using these types of services currently.

DEP Grant ideas- **Katie** will find out whether the April 15 deadline has been extended. Shed expansion was discussed, and question about the current shed and building permits was brought up.

Dumping update- Sherriff's department has been notified that this is happening on Stone Tree Road. Officer Mark Anderson said that he would keep an eye on it. Katie asked the resident to call the officer directly if the problem persists. Committee is asked to keep a look out also. Dumping of recyclables usually happens on Thursday nights, before the Friday pickup.

Craig's leaking truck- Throughout the month of April, there were three resident complaints about Craig's truck leaking some type of oil/hydraulic fluid onto the roadway during pickup. Craig was informed on two separate occasions, and has had mixed reactions. In the end, Craig acknowledged an oil leak, and said that he would put a pad down at stops where he has to sit for a while, or pick up the trash with a pickup truck and transfer it to the large compactor later. Committee was asked to take pictures if we see fresh fluid after the truck has gone by. Discussion about informing the Select Board if this continues. Committee agrees that this is something that must be fixed.

Ecomaine- Received a draft contract today. Katie emailed Riverside for a quote on hauling. **Paul** will look into Fiberrite again, and see what folks are saying about the service. Cost to haul there could be high-could piggyback on another community possibly.

Summer Schedule notice- Sent out on Tuesday, May 20.

Shed report and resident calls- 250 pounds of scrap metal was picked up by C&S. 3 calls about the leaking truck and environmental concerns relative to this problem.

Other items? **Katie** will ask Casella for a draft contract for next year.
